LARGE GRANTS

The grant program is designed to encourage, facilitate, recognize, and reward innovative and creative instructional approaches to the accomplishment of classroom program objectives. Individuals or teams employed by CMS, who are involved in the instruction of students or related support services benefiting students, are eligible to apply for grants.

The Foundation awarded \$29,494,76 last year. The schools and teachers receiving grants were: CHS Freshman Academy, Parkview Elementary, Clovis High School, Marshall Middle School, Gattis Middle School, Yucca Middle School, Arts Academy at Bella Vista, and Mesa Elementary School.

The Foundation created a new grant named the CMS Teacher and Support Staff Recognition Award. The total for the 2019-20 grant was \$3275.

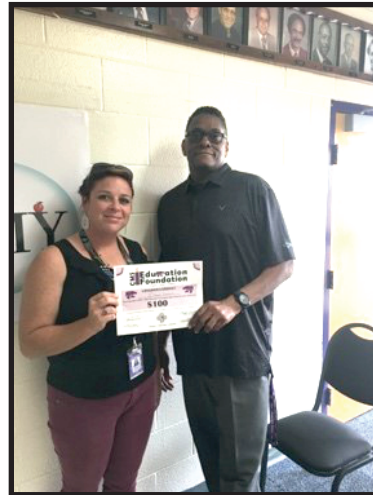
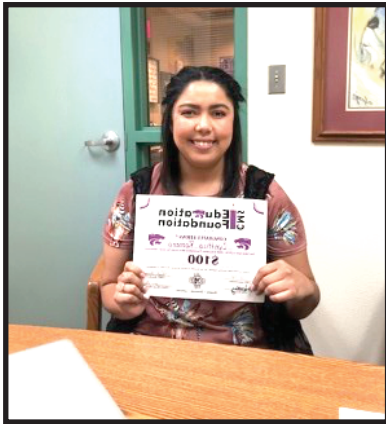

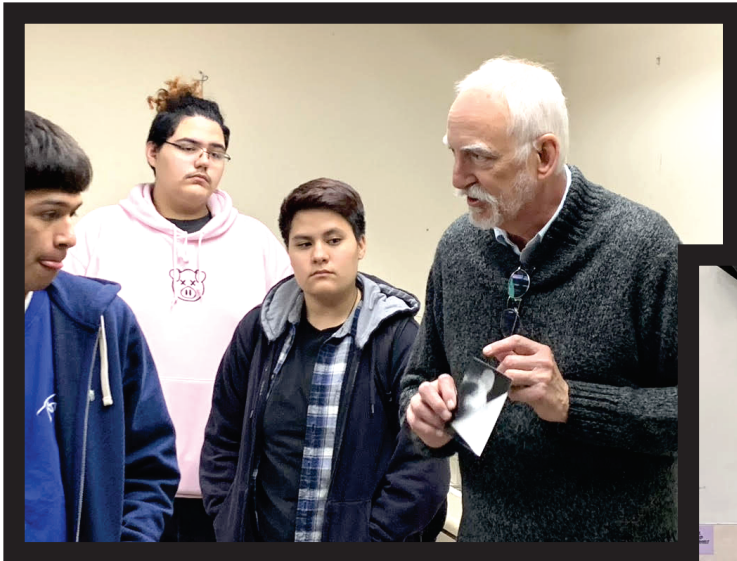

We will honor the 2020 recipients, as well as the 2021 recipients.

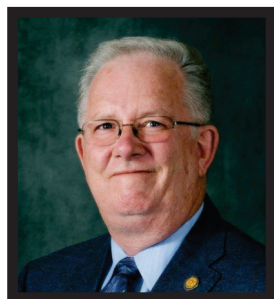
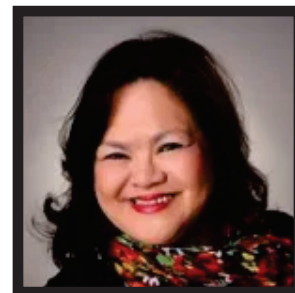
