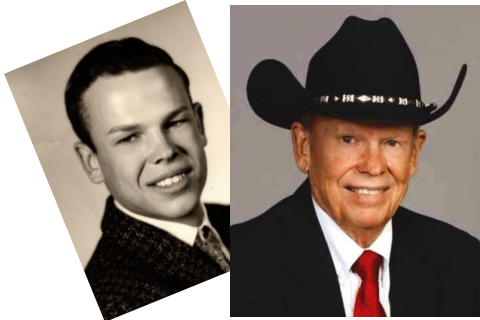
CMS Education Foundation Alumni Committee - Hall of Honor Luncheon

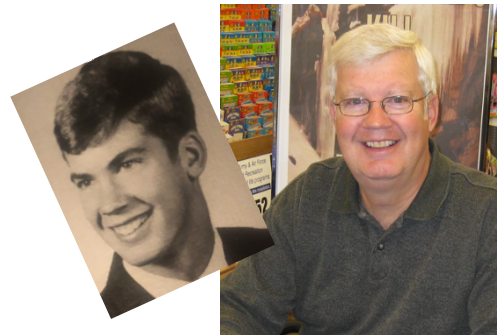

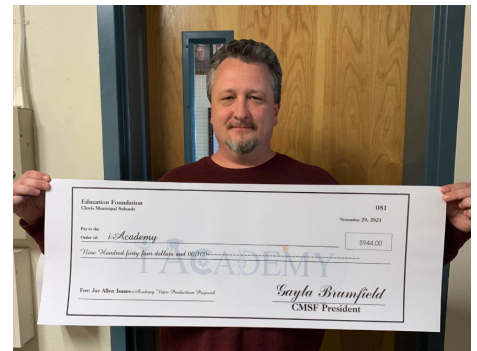

The Young Masters Program

The CMS Education Foundation sponsors a **Young Masters Juried Art Exhibition** for students attending Clovis High School and CHS Freshman Academy. Working in close collaboration with Clovis Community College (CCC), the goals of the museum exhibition are to celebrate and encourage young master artists and their dedicated teachers for demonstrating excellence in artistic expression and education.



Cash awards are given to Best of Show (\$300); 1st Place (\$200); 2nd Place (\$150); 3rd Place (\$100); and Honorable Mentions (\$50). Students are honored at a reception held at the Eula Mae Edwards Museum & Gallery at Clovis Community College, where students' artwork is displayed.

During the past school year, there were considerable changes - staffing issues, in particular - at both Clovis Community College and in the Clovis Schools' art departments, resulting in the Young Masters Program requiring a "reset."

We're already making future plans, however, and have been in touch with the pertinent stakeholders at both CCC and CHS. For example, the guest art instructor for this fall's workshop for students has already been secured.
